What do Compact Champions do?

Who are Warwickshire Compact Champions?

Anyone can be a Compact Champion. It's a voluntary role, typically only a couple of hours per month, in which you:

- Provide a contact point in your organisation for Compact information and advice
- Encourage and facilitate the organisation's Compact Compliance
- Develop understanding of the Compact in practice, and share the learning.

Champions make Compact working happen, by getting the Compact known and used in their organisation. They help relationships between voluntary groups and public bodies to run smoothly, by encouraging good practice and partnership working, with the benefits going to all partners.

Where do they come from?

Champions come from public bodies and voluntary groups, as well as national voluntary organisations and government. They work to ensure everyone (whether trustees, staff or volunteers) knows and uses their Compact. Champions in public bodies ensure that people know about the Compact at an operational level, and those in local groups are vital to upholding the sector's independence.
